<b>Test Details</b>	The ACT is a national college admissions exam accepted by all four-year colleges and universities in the United States. The test questions are related to what students learn in high school. It's a multiple choice exam with prep tests offered online to help students prepare.	The SAT is a college admissions test taken by many high school students in the United States. The exam is offered several times a year and tests a student's aptitude in reading, math, and writing. <u>SAT Subject Tests</u> are also offered that allow students to showcase their knowledge in a specific subject area.				
<b>Sections</b>	Math, Science, English, Reading, Writing (optional & scored separately).	Reading, Math, Writing (optional & scored separately).				
<b>Scoring System</b>	A composite score as well as a score for each subtest (Math, Science, English, Reading) range from 1 (low) to 36 (high).	Total score range from 400-1600; Evidenced based Reading & Writing range from 200-800; Math range from 200-800.				
<b>Cost</b>	\$60.00 (no writing) or \$85.00 (with writing).	\$55.00 (no essay) SAT Subject Specific Test fees vary

<b>How To Register</b>	Create an account on the ACT website and follow steps for test registration. Students must register and pay each time they want to test (except for the ACT taken the junior year at AHS).	Create an account on the COLLEGEBOARD website and follow steps for test registration. Students must register and pay each time they want to test.				
<b>When to take the Test</b>	Most students take the ACT for the first time in the spring of their junior year in high school; usually after completing Algebra II. AHS administers in February to all current juniors; (students do not need to register for this February test).	Most students take the SAT for the first time in the spring of their junior year in high school.				
<b>Add'l Info</b>	Some students are eligible for a fee waiver. Review the <u>ACT Fee Waiver form</u> to learn more.	Some students are eligible for a fee waiver. Review the <u>SAT Fee Waiver form</u> to learn more.

<b>Score Release Dates</b>	Most ACT scores are available through your ACT account within 2 weeks after testing (or 5 weeks for the writing test) but can take up to 8 weeks from the testing date.			Most SAT scores are released about two weeks after test day. June scores take longer, up to six weeks.

  - Scroll through the banner options until you reach the College Prep Center and click on it.
  - Choose your test and get started.
