# OHIO TESTS REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION

Students must earn a cumulative score of 18 points, (4 points in Math, 4 points in English, and 6 points between Science & Social Studies) using seven end-of-course state tests over four years of high school. End of Course exams are required for the following courses:

- **ELA 9**
- **ELA 10**
- **ALGEBRA I**
- **GEOMETRY**
- **BIOLOGY**
- **AMERICAN HISTORY**
- **AMERICAN GOVERNMENT**

# New Courses (Cont.)

## MTHM 158 Quantitative Reasoning

- Available to both CCP & Non-CCP students
- a new math course for seniors who plan to pursue a degree that will not require them to take College Algebra, PreCalculus, or Calculus
- Examples: Fashion Design, Journalism, History

Available to juniors and seniors who have *not* taken AP Microeconomics
